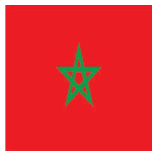

Documents bundling tips

Make sure the documents are in PDF format.

Make sure you include proper file names and category.

Make sure irrelevant pages are removed, there are no missing pages or substandard quality pages.

Create montage where helpful and presentable

Keep each file less than 6 MB in size.

Make sure payslips, bank statements and other date relevant items are in date order.

Remove any passcode or other protection from the documents and do not use folders or ZIP together files.

Do not drown your supporting documents with unrelated and large number of files or pages.

Get help so that things are presentable.

UK spouse visa is an expensive (£4,000+ per person) and difficult application to make. The requirements are many and has specified items that must be provided in support (usually 120 to 250 pages in support). The applicant has the duty to provide the items and failing to do so will result in a refusal, loss of fees paid and UK settlement plans ruined.

This book is an overview of the requirements, procedures and costs. It provides some guidance as to what is generally required and points to the resources that would need to be utilized, the approved centres for English language, TB testing and also where the fingerprints may be provided.

A must read for anyone looking to consider UK family visas for themselves, loved ones, friends or clients.
