Your test must be from a clinic approved by the Home Office. We will not accept a TB test certificate from a clinic we have not approved.

There are no approved clinics in Mauritania so if you're from there you'll need to travel to Morocco to be tested.

Test fees

300 dirhams

What you should bring with you

- valid identification which contains your photograph, such as a passport, national ID card or Refugee Asylum Seeker Card
- a photocopy of your identification
- the tuberculosis test fee

Attending the clinic

You should contact one of the approved clinics to book an appointment and make it clear you need the test for a UK visa application.

You can expect to get an appointment within a few days of your request. At busy times you may have to wait 10 days for an appointment, especially during the UK student visa peak season between June and September.

If you would like an appointment with a female clinician, please ask the clinic when you schedule your appointment.

If you need to cancel your appointment you should contact the clinic as soon as possible.

What you should bring with you:

- proof of identification, which contains your photograph, such as your passport
- 4 passport sized photographs
- the TB test fee
- if you have had TB in the past or have any other lung disease, you should provide details of your previous screening and, if possible, your medical notes and x-ray result

Test fees

The fee for each TB screening x-ray is 620 Dhirams. For most applicants this is where the testing process will end and your certificate will then be issued.

If the results of the x-ray indicate you require additional screening, this will have a cost of up to 375 Dhirams. The maximum total amount anyone will pay for the screening process is 995 Dhirams.

The cost of the test is in addition to the visa application fee.

The test fee does not cover treatment if you have TB.
